**Transition Town Totnes** aims to act as a catalyst for Totnes to explore how to prepare for and adapt to life beyond cheap oil and gas. Since its launch in September 2006 it has;

- Run a workshop on Oil Vulnerability Auditing with local businesses, with pilot project to follow
- Delivered 'Skilling Up for Powerdown' 10 week evening class, which restarts Monday 23rd April
- Presented a popular series of film screenings and talks
- Run 3 Open Space community think-tank days
- Established a number of groups exploring different areas, such as food, health and energy.
- Begun collecting Oral History interviews of memories of life before cheap oil.

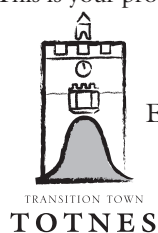

There are now Transition Towns Moretonhampstead, Falmouth, Stroud and Lewes, as well as Transition Penwith in Cornwall.

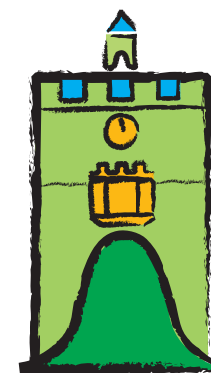
